#### Legislative Session Officially Underway

The 2024 legislative session is upon us with January 8th marking day-one of the 60-day short session. The first week on 'the hill' has been filled with member meetings, stakeholder discussions, bill negotiations, and committee hearings. This is the supplemental or "even" year of the biennium which means a lot fewer bills get passed and a lot less money gets spent. But that doesn't mean meaningful policy doesn't get deliberated, heard, and sometimes even passed into law.

Governor Inslee has released his supplemental state operating budget as well as capital and transportation budgets. These are not final budgets but instead a starting point for the House and Senate to begin crafting their versions of the spending packages for the remainder of the biennium which ends June 30<sup>th</sup>, 2025.

#### **Bill Highlights**

House Bill 2051 - "Reducing emissions from small off-road engines" is the small gas engines bill which has been publicized since before the holidays. This bill seeks to ban all gas-powered engines of 25 horsepower and less to include lawn mowers, leaf blowers, chainsaws, weed eaters, generators, and others. The House Environment and Energy Committee heard the bill on Thursday morning with mixed reviews on both sides. The committee room was full with an overflow room for viewing which showed strong feelings on both sides of the matter.

While the bill is still technically "alive" this session, it's beginning to look like the process might be slowing down and leaning towards a deliberate approach in the interim to bring stakeholders together for a better solution. Stay tuned for more on this bill as the session moves ahead.

#### **Capital "Improvement" Projects Update**

Grange members from across the state have been meeting with legislators regarding their capital budget requests. This year being a supplemental year there are less dollars to spread around the state for capital projects, but we are getting some traction on several of the asks and getting great engagement on many of the projects. This sets us up well for more of these projects in the full budget cycle of 2025.

Select House or Senate

Committee: Choose the committee where you bill is

being heard

Meetings: Choose the date of the hearing

Select the bill you want from the list.

#### **Select:**

I would like to submit written testimony.

I would like to testify live during the hearing.

I would like my position noted for the legislative record.

You may check to see who else has signed in to testify.

On the next screen, fill in all the blanks and submit.

You will receive an email with a link for the hearing. At the appropriate time, join the meeting and wait to be admitted.

When you are called to speak, introduce yourself and speak for 1-2 minutes.

To prepare, write down what you want to say. Read it aloud several times. Time yourself.
