

Monday, February 26, 2024 (day 50 of the 60-day Session)

This week the House and Senate released their versions of the supplemental operating, transportation, and capital budgets. These documents came out very similar in size and scope but with some differences which are always expected. The budget documents can be viewed here under the "Latest Budget proposals" tab. And the new supplemental spending package from the House by agency detail can be viewed here.

This week also marks the sprint to the final committee cutoffs which will take place on Monday February 26th. Monday is the second fiscal cutoff where all bills requiring public tax dollars must be moved with a favorable vote to the Rules Committee. Once the 2/26 deadline has passed we break into "floor action" for the remainder of session. The end of session floor action is where most of the reconciliation and haggling occurs.

Ahead of this final committee deadline the legislature worked the weekend to pass supplemental bills as well as the budgets out of committee to await the final day of session for reconciliation and passage.

Bill Highlight

HB 1589 - Supporting Washington's clean energy economy and transitioning to a clean, affordable, and reliable energy future.

This legislative update has referenced HB 1589 several times over the course of the session. We spoke with the Senate Ag chairman this week and it is unclear if the majority caucus has the votes to pass this piece of legislation this year, but there is certainly some reservations about the bill from several majority caucus legislators. The bill has landed in the same place it ended last session which is the Senate Rules Committee where it was placed on X file and held until this session. Now it awaits a vote in Rules and a subsequent floor vote if it passes that final hurdle.

How to Testify on Bills this Year

As a reminder you can easily participate in the lawmaking process by contacting your elected state representatives through the online legislative tools.

Start here: https://app.leg.wa.gov/csiremote/

Select House or Senate

Committee: Choose the committee where you bill is

being heard

Meetings: Choose the date of the hearing

Select the bill you want from the list.

Select:

I would like to submit written testimony.

I would like to testify live during the hearing. I would like my position noted for the legislative record.

You may check to see who else has signed in to testify.

On the next screen, fill in all the blanks and submit.

You will receive an email with a link for the hearing. At the appropriate time, join the meeting and wait to be admitted.

When you are called to speak, introduce yourself and speak for 1-2 minutes.

To prepare, write down what you want to say. Read it aloud several times. Time yourself.
