- 4. Use no more than 10 pieces of paper for your report (both sides of each page may be used). Include photos, news articles, thank you notes, and any other supporting material. This form **MUST** be the first page. Include number of Junior Grangers involved in each project and the approximate number of hours spent on each project. This completed form will be judged.
- 5. Only those projects and activities, which benefit others, should be included as part of this Community Service Report. Be sure to tell the whole story.
- 6. To represent our state in the national contest, the report must be consolidated down to a maximum of three pages (may use front and back of each page).
