Monday, January 19, 2025 (day 8 of the 90-day Session)

Legislative Session Officially Underway

The first week of session has come and gone with a lot of new bills being introduced into the second half of the biennium. We have seen over 500 new bill introductions bringing the total for the biennium to over 2700 bills. The Legislature began its 60-day supplemental session on January 12, set to adjourn March 12. As of the beginning of session, Democrats hold majorities in the House (59-39) and Senate (30-19).

Opening day featured swearing-in, rule adoption, and majority party leaders highlighting priorities: budget talks, public safety, a wealth tax on millionaires, and housing initiatives. House Speaker Laurie Jenkins even emphasized bipartisan cooperation before committees began.

Governor Ferguson's State of the State Address

In his recent State of the State speech, Gov. Bob Ferguson emphasized Democratic priorities, including support for a new state income tax on individuals earning over \$1 million annually. He proposed pairing it with expanded tax credits for lower-income families via the Working Families Tax Credit and some relief for small businesses. The governor also committed to signing a bill banning law enforcement from wearing masks. He highlighted efforts to speed up licensing, respond to recent flooding, and boost infrastructure and housing investments, while not addressing the Climate Commitment Act. Overall, Ferguson praised the state's handling of crises and called for recognition of its achievements. The struggling agriculture industry was not mentioned.

Governor Ferguson Proposed Budget

- **Operating Budget:** The Governor's proposed budget would increase the total state operating budget to about \$79 billion (1.2% increase), and would reduce the \$2.3 billion projected deficit via cuts, rainy-day drawdown, and Climate Commitment Act fund redirection. The governor supports a future millionaires' tax which is a 9.9% tax on earnings greater than \$1 million which is expected to raise about \$3 billion by 2029.

- **Transportation Budget:** Additional \$3 billion for roads, bridges, ferries including Columbia River dredging, bridge preservation and new ferries.
- **Capital Budget:** Includes \$237 million in new money for housing and a proposed \$2.2M for WSU plant sciences lab.

Bills of Interest:

- **[HB 2279](#):** Directs Dept. of Agriculture to evaluate/regulate PFAS (forever chemicals) in fertilizers and pesticides, with potential to deny/cancel registrations starting 2027.
- **[SB 5360](#):** Strengthens environmental crimes (Clean Water/Air Act, hazardous waste), elevating some violations to felonies; mirrors federal law but lacks individual liability protections.
- **[HB 2516](#)** — Proposes a moratorium on certain rodenticides (rat/mouse poisons), with no current agriculture exemption.

Bills on collective bargaining for uncovered employees (including agricultural workers):

- **[SB 6045 & HB 2409](#)** — Extend collective bargaining rights to agricultural employees under the Public Employment Relations Commission (PERC).
- **[SB 6117](#)** — Concerning collective bargaining for employees not covered by the national labor relations act. Senate Committee on Labor & Commerce.

How to Testify on Bills this Year

As a reminder you can easily participate in the lawmaking process by contacting your elected state representatives through the online legislative tools.

Start here: <https://app.leg.wa.gov/csiremote/>

Select **House** or **Senate**

Committee: **Choose the committee where you bill is being heard**

Meetings: **Choose the date of the hearing**

Select the bill you want from the list.

Select:

I would like to submit written testimony.

I would like to testify live during the hearing.

I would like my position noted for the legislative record.

You may check to see who else has signed in to testify.

On the next screen, fill in all the blanks and submit.

You will receive an email with a link for the hearing. At the appropriate time, join the meeting and wait to be admitted.

When you are called to speak, introduce yourself and speak for 1-2 minutes.

To prepare, write down what you want to say. Read it aloud several times. Time yourself.
